A site meeting was held on 9th March and was attended by Cllrs Mrs Falconer, Mrs Goodworth, Miss Howie and Osborne. The response submitted to the local planning authority was as follows:

Stansted PC has no objection to this application. Members are aware that the application is contrary to Green Belt policy in that it provides for 4 extra dwellings in the Green Belt. However the offices in one of the redundant agricultural buildings have been unlet and unoccupied for over 12 months and have proved impossible to re-let and this use is now unviable. When occupied by businesses, there were far more traffic movements including

cars, vans and larger vehicles comprising workers, collections and deliveries, than would be generated by 4 dwellings. The proposed residential development is small and would not be detrimental to the area.

8 TM/13/00393/FL: Cob Trees, Hatham Green Lane, Stansted: Retrospective application i for 3 domestic lighting columns

After discussion, it was agreed to object as follows:

Stansted Parish Council objects to this application on highways grounds, on grounds of loss of amenity and health issues to local residents.and on grounds of light pollution.

The site is at the junction of Hatham Green Lane and Plaxdale Green Road and the lighting is a distraction to road users and confusing to them.

The lighting on this property is visible to a large part of the village, which is a loss of amenity both to immediate and more distant neighbours. This is causing a health issue for other residents, for example due to the topography, one of the lights shines directly into the kitchen of a property on the other side of Plaxdale Green Road, downhill of Cob Trees

The Parish Council considers the lighting overpowering and a source of light pollution. The application is for "domestic lighting columns" but there are strong security lights.

around the building and the Parish Council queries why these were not included in the application The Parish Council continues to receive complaints about the lighting at Cob Trees.

The Parish Council is asking its Borough Councillors for this application to be called in for consideration by the Borough Council's Planning Committee.
