1 APOLOGIES

An apology for late arrival was received from Cllr Mrs Falconer. Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs Mrs Sarah Hohler, Kent County Council and Matthew Balfour, Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council

2 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Cllr Mrs Goodworth declared a pecuniary interest in item 5a(i), planning application for Plaxdale Green Farm, as she lived directly opposite the site.

3 MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 13 MAY 2013

It was proposed by Cllr Miss Howie, seconded by Cllr Osborne and agreed the minutes of the meeting held on 13 May 2013 be signed as a true record.

The Chairman suspended the meeting for Cllr Mrs Kemp to give her report.

Cllr Mrs Kemp said there was nothing she wished to comment on.

The Chairman thanked Cllr Mrs Kemp and reconvened the meeting.

5 PLANNING.

a Applications

86 i TM/13/01037/FL: Plaxdale Green Farm, Plaxdale Green Road, Stansted: Change of use

and conversion of 7 no. former agricultural buildings to provide 7 no. live/work units with associated parking, access and landscaping and the demolition of 3 no. former agricultural buildings.

Having declared a pecuniary interest, Cllr Mrs Goodworth left the room.

The Chairman suspended the meeting to enable the applicant, his planning consultant and members of the public to speak.

The applicant introduced John Collins of DHA Planning who gave a presentation of the proposals. Questions asked included the types of businesses likely to be involved; the numbers of workers, whether the units would be for sale or for rent and concern over the number of traffic movements.

The Chairman thanked the applicant, Mr Collins and the members of the public and reconvened the meeting.

After discussion, it was agreed to respond as follows:

Stansted Parish Council has no objection in principle to this application; however there are concerns that at some point in the future there may be applications for further development on the site, or to convert the work units to residential, which would be resisted by the Parish Council. The Parish Council would therefore request that a condition or informative is imposed that would prevent further development or conversion of the work units.

Should permission be granted and should a S106 or Community Infrastructure Levy agreement be made, the Parish Council requests that a contribution is made towards renewal of the playground facilities on Stansted Recreation Ground, which is currently under consideration by the Parish Council and for which the Parish Council is building up reserved funds.

Cllr Mrs Goodworth returned to the meeting.

87 TM/13/01234/FL: Hope Cottage, Labour-in-Vain Road, Stansted: Proposed extension to ii side of existing cottage to form a kitchen/breakfast on the ground floor with music room/en-suite above

Although permission for the column lights had been refused, it was the lighting on the house that was causing problems for other residents. It was understood from Cllr Mrs Kemp that she would discuss the situation with the enforcement team.

94 iv Applications for Fairseat Cottage and Fairseat Lodge

Cllrs Mrs Goodworth and Miss Howie had attended the Borough Council's Planning Committee, but the applications had been withdrawn from the agenda for that night. However there would be a members' site inspection and it was hoped that new proposals for Fairseat Cottage would be available by then. The legal department had not allowed both applications to be taken together.
